Nonnewaug GradNite Meeting October 2, 2017 Notes

Welcome and Introductions

Introduced Christine Paige–Chair, Joann Bodie- Co-Chair, Linda McCarthy- Secretary and Julie Biron-long time committee member

- **GradNite Overview** discussed what GradNite offers that evening and what is entailed throughout the year to make this night possible
- Financial Report- shared the Expenses of GradNite (approximately \$15,000-\$17,000 this is a 40% decrease when this committee started in 2013. Cost was \$25,000) GradNite is not a separate entity like PTO's, all funds/activities are run through the region. We have absorbed our own expenses regarding extra mailings to businesses and parents and storage facility for all of GradNite supplies, as the school has no space available. Valuable information was shared regarding the work involved and stressed that fundraising is a huge component of a successful GradNite. Funding for this event is 1/3 business and civic organization donations, 1/3 fundraising and 1/3 parent donations. Depending upon student/parent involvement we could potentially decrease the parent donation portion.
- Social Media Linda M is handling all the social media. The attendees were encouraged to promote all aspects of GradNite and to "follow", "like" and "share" GradNite on Facebook, Twitter and Instagram. Linda explained that Instagram is part of our push to reach out to and encourage the senior class for their involvement in GradNite. Other opportunities the committee is exploring as a way of exciting seniors include a T-Shirt Design Contest, events and fundraisers related to Prom, GradNite Senior Survey where they get to rate, vote and suggest activities for their GradNite celebration as well as the opportunity to earn extra raffle (drawing) tickets for the evening of GradNite, when they participate in ProGrad activities throughout the year.

While this might not be a possibility through the lunch program, the committee members thought this to be a good idea and will look into this as an opportunity to fundraise through local businesses
- David Bibbey suggested the possibility of adding an online donation option. It was explained that we would not be able to do this because while we are a not for profit organization under the umbrella of Region 14, we unfortunately are not our own 501c and therefore cannot have our own bank account to deposit funds. It was suggested that the committee look to another local organization that would be willing to do this for us. The committee thought this to be a good idea and will look into options.
- David Bibbey suggested the possibility of the NHS DECA club using GradNite as a project to gain some marketing experience. He will discuss the possibility with the DECA club to see if they would have any interest.
- Marie Feola volunteered to organize a group of seniors to hang GradNite fundraising flyers at local businesses around town starting with our upcoming Fall Clothing Drive.
